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**Dress Code:**

MTBA has a simple guideline for everyone: dress modest. Each adult sponsor has the responsibility to ensure this guideline is communicated to students and is met while at camp. It is not the responsibility of the camp or Summit staff to monitor the dress code. Ultimately, the Executive Director and coordinators have final say about dress code issues. Campers can only wear what they bring to camp. So, please communicate these guidelines to them prior to packing and leaving for the week of camp.

**While at camp, we ask that students and adults:**

1. Wear short sleeved t-shirts and modest shorts (when hands are extended to the side and front, finger tips must touch fabric) during the day due to the nature of recreation and group building activities.
2. Wear modest shorts, dresses, pants, and jeans for worship. Long pants are required for students or adults participating in worship on stage.
3. Do not dress in a way that calls attention to underwear (sagging your pants, rolling down your waistbands, etc).
4. Closed-toe, closed heel-shoes are required at all times while on campus.

**Students are not allowed to wear anything that:**

1. Advertizes alcohol, tobacco, or illegal drugs.
  2. Explicitly or implicitly promotes racism, sexism, or hatred of any group or person.
  3. Explicitly or implicitly refers to sexual actions or situations.
  4. Has spaghetti/small straps or open backs, except for sleepwear.
  5. Is excessively short or tight fitting.
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
