



**What to Bring:**

1. Sleeping bag and pillow, or linens for a twin bed; towels, and all personal articles such as toothbrush, shampoo, etc... There is no store available to purchase personal care items. (For emergencies, contact the health care provider.)
2. Flashlight for use in the evenings and for travel to and from the bathhouse after dark.
3. Appropriate clothing (see Dress Code): Some "grubby" clothes will be needed for chosen tract times or outdoor recreation. Tennis shoes are required at all times due to the campus terrain. It is wise to bring a rain jacket, sweatshirts, and clothes for layering, as this is a mountain camp, and it can be quite chilly even in the summer. Bring enough clothes for the week, as laundry services are not available.
4. Bible, notepad, and pen.
5. Articles for Night Life opportunities throughout the week, such as props, instruments and costumes.
6. Spending Money: A missions offering will be taken up during the week. We have a Summit Store in which students may purchase apparel and recreation product. A snack shop will be open at various times for purchases. Some track times may require a small additional cost. Campers may want sponsors to hold it for them until needed.
7. A camera/video camera (optional). MTBA is not responsible for lost or damaged items. Personal valuables are the owners' responsibility.

**Camp Guidelines:**

1. Attend and participate in all camp program elements and arrive on time or be early.
2. Students are required to stay within the campus boundaries at all times. MTBA shares the mountain top with wild animals, including bears.
3. No gum or food/drink is allowed in the worship center. Only water is acceptable during this time.
4. Guys are not allowed in girls' cabins and vice versa.
5. Be in your cabin no later than 11:00pm in order to get plenty of needed rest.
6. Practical jokes of any sort are not permitted at camp.
7. Make sure you stay within the dress code.
8. Wear your nametag at all times.
9. Drink lots of water and eat three meals a day.
10. No Public Display of Affection.
11. No littering.
12. Use common sense and be safe.

**What to Leave:**

1. Alcohol, tobacco products, and illegal drugs. Appropriate action will be taken if these items are found in anyone's possession.
2. Fireworks or matches.
3. Weapons of any kind.
4. Mobile Phones: Group Leaders have the authority to allow mobile devices.
5. MP3 players, iPods, portable gaming devices, laptops, etc... Music players may be used during church group time, or for practicing special music. We appreciate the Group Leaders' help in keeping these distractions at bay.
6. Items that may be used for pranks such as water balloons, shaving cream, silly string, etc. Pranks are not allowed at camp! Your church will be charged for any damages or issues related to clean up.
7. Skateboards, roller blades, and bicycles, are not allowed at camp.
